Family Guide

Family Guides were distributed to all families at the beginning of term. We still have some outstanding return forms. The Guide is an essential document, as it contains information about how we work as a school. It also contains dates for internal examinations, school photographer, end of year prize-givings etc. It is important for us to know that you have a copy, and that you have read it. To ensure that is the case, we ask you to acknowledge receipt by returning the form that was enclosed in the Guide.

Kiss and Fly, Drop Off, Pick Up Area, Depose Minute

We ask parents of Secondary School students (Form 7 to 13) to drop off and pick up in the bus stop in front of the School. Linda, from the Police Municipal, is in our slip road to ensure that students cross safely inside the campus. Last week a number of parents (Primary) parked and left their cars in the

bus stop, bringing the system to a grinding halt and making it dangerous to drop off students. To ensure that the 270 secondary school students can be dropped off without danger under no circumstances should parents park in the bus stop. A large copy of this part of the newsletter will appear on the windscreen of offenders. Thank you for your consideration.

Sports Day

As last year, Sports Day for Forms 5 to 13 will be held at the Stade Eric Estival in Mandelieu on Friday 3rd October. Students in these classes have already received information. Parents who have some free time during that day are very welcome to come along and support. Sports Day for the remainder of Primary classes will be later in the year.

The Danger of Peanuts etc as Snacks

We would strongly advise you not to give your child peanuts, or other nuts, in their snacks. Children tend to run around at break and lunchtimes and nuts can easily get stuck in their throats. It would also avoid them sharing with children who are allergic to nuts.

Wednesday Lunchtimes

Most children leave the campus straight after school on Wednesdays. However, there are some who stay for activities at School. Didier our chef will continue to make sandwiches, slices of pizza, brownies, doughnuts and drinks available on Wednesday lunchtimes for students who wish to pre-order in the office on Tuesdays. Please note that students other than Form 12 & 13 may not leave the campus and then return later for an activity unless accompanied by their parents. Students who have little time before an activity elsewhere may also like to take advantage of the service.

I would like to extend a warm welcome to our new families and say how nice it is to see a lot of familiar faces. I hope you have benefited from a relaxed summer and that this year will be a successful one for all our students.

Although we all believe the sun shines eternally on the Côte d'Azur, the reality is that we do see our fair share of rain. Mougins School is quite prepared for this eventuality and we have superb umbrellas for sale in the office. Automatically opening; in black and silver with the school logo printed on one panel, large enough to shelter the family, these are a must for the winter months – stocks are limited so buy early to avoid disappointment. The cost is 20€ and they can be found in the Office.

In October France celebrates 'La Semaine du Goût'. The week is marked by various events, particularly in Schools and Mougins School will be celebrating

both in the Canteen and in the classroom. Our Chef will be preparing a celebration of French regional cooking: Auvergne, Brittany, Alsace and Savoie with appropriate menus.
