Examination Results and Universities

You will find full coverage of last year's (I)GCSE, AS and A Level results, which were excellent, and a full list of last year's 33 graduating students and their destination for higher education. Mougins School does not test for entry, nor does it select who sits external examinations. All students are entered for (I)GCSEs, when the time comes. To access A level studies, students have to achieve a minimum of 5 (I)GCSEs with grades A* to C. Please read the results and the university places very carefully and feel free to challenge critics, or direct them to any member of staff. They either don't understand the system, in which case, we can enlighten them, or they are jealous their children are not at Mougins School!

From the Desk of Sue Dunnachie

May I take this opportunity to welcome students and parents, both those we know and those with whom we are becoming acquainted. I hope that this scholastic year will bring you success and peace of mind.

With the support of a very active PTA, Mougins School endeavours to raise money each year for several **charities** and, last year, we raised 9,183€. The major part of this sum is pledged to the purchase of a Guide Dog for the Blind. This project costs 16,000€ of which 6,000€ has now been raised and we will continue with the challenge this year. The remaining money went to: Red Nose Day, Sidaction, Sargent Cancer Care, Roald Dahl Foundation, Ligue contre le Cancer and Restaurant du Coeur. I believe that it is important to participate in local causes and would dearly love to be able to present a Guide Dog at the end of the year. We have been supporting the Association in Biot for several years and this would be the culmination of a lot of enthusiastic work. You can follow the fund-raising for this cause by looking at 'Paws for Thought', our friendly Labrador on the wall of the terrace of the Administration Building. A Wine Tasting Evening is one of the forthcoming events planned to raise funds for this cause. Ideas or donations are always welcome.

On 8th October **Form 11** had the privilege of welcoming a guest speaker, John Mann, who has done some extraordinary work in **Cambodia** and is in the process of completing the construction of a second school which serves

three villages. Fifty per cent of the population in Cambodia is under 15, the children in these three villages had never been given any form of education and the average wage is one dollar a day, including that of the teachers responsible for a class of eighty pupils. The expatriate community has been very instrumental in raising money for this worthwhile cause, led by Hilary King who directed the Red Pear Theatre for many years. Our relationship with Hilary has been a long and fruitful one and we will endeavour to support this cause with her. A football tournament will be organised later in the year to raise funds to furnish the schools with the necessary equipment.

Initiated by Mrs Derriman, one of our parents, the **Soroptimist International** organisation (professional women worldwide working to transform the lives of women and their children) will be working with the **Primary School** on the topic of water conservation. A number of events will be organised to raise awareness of International Water Day that takes place in March 2010 and will culminate in an art competition aided by Mrs Derriman who is, herself, an artist.

Results for (I)GCSEs are given for Form 11 only, including any subjects they took a year early in Form 10. The A*-C pass rate this year was our best ever – **88.0%**. Of the 44 students in Form 11, **88.6%** achieved at **least 5** (I)GCSEs with A*-C
